



Frequently Asked Questions – FAQ's

Q. What are the Stockton Community Games?

- City of Stockton Communities (organized by zip codes) will be able to participate at their local community center in a variety of games. Each center will host a qualifying event where winners will advance to the finals at Stribley Community Center on July 20.

Q. When and where do the Stockton Community Games take place?

- Qualifying events will be from 10 am to 3 pm on the following Saturdays at each of the four City of Stockton Community Centers:

June 1 at Van Buskirk Community Center

June 8 at Stribley Community Center

June 22 at Rue Community Center

June 29 at Seifert Community Center

- Finals:
Opening Ceremony will start at 9 am with events starting at 10:45 am on Saturday, July 20 at Stribley Community Center

Q. Who is eligible to participate, and must I reside in Stockton?

- Community members ages 7 to adult residing in city zip codes can register to participate at one of the City of Stockton Community Centers:

Rue - 95209, 95210, 95212

Seifert - 95207, 95211, 95219

Stribley - 95204, 95205, 95215

Van Buskirk – 95202, 95203, 95206

Q. Can I represent more than one community?

- No, only the zip code where you reside in.

Q. Why are the Stockton Community Games taking place?

- To develop community cohesion with others in a fun environment through games.

Q. Are there age groups?

- Yes, ages 7 to 13, 7 to adult, and 14 to adult depending on the event.
- Individual competitions have male and female divisions.
- Team competitions consist of teams of 2, 4, or 6 players depending on the event.

Q. What events will be available?

Q. What are the rules?

- See rules for each event on www.stocktonca.gov/recreation.

Q. How many events can I participate in?

- All events with corresponding age groups but only at one community center per zip code.

Q. Will equipment be provided?

- Yes, equipment will be provided for each event.

Q. How do I register?

- Individuals and teams can find out how to register at www.stocktonca.gov/recreation, [register online](#), or at a City of Stockton Community Center.

Q. Am I guaranteed a chance to compete?

- All participants registering by the deadline will be able to compete.

Q. How will I be contacted and informed about the event after I register?

- Reminders will be emailed the week before each qualifier and final event.

Q. Is there a cost to participate?

- All events are free.

Q. Will I win anything?

- Qualifiers for the finals will receive a t-shirt to wear at the finals.
- Medals will be awarded to first and second places at finals.

Q. Where do we check in on the day of the event?

- Each community center will have a designated check-in area set up.

Q. How will we know who advances to the finals?

- Winners will be announced at the end of each qualifier, notified following each qualifier, and results posted at each community center.

Q. Will all events take place in one day?

- Yes, all events will take place on the same day. Each community center will host qualifiers on scheduled dates.

Q. Are guests welcome to spectate?

- Yes, everyone is welcome to attend the qualifying events and the finals.

Q. Will food be provided?

- No

Q. Will there be vendors?

- No

Q. Is transportation available?

- Please check the SJRTD [bus schedule](#) for public transportation to the community centers.

Q. Is parking available?

- Limited parking is available at each community center.

Q. Are uniforms or special shoes required?

- Competitors qualifying for the finals will be provided with an official shirt to wear during the final events. Athletic shoes are recommended.

Q. Will there be any ceremonies/dignitaries?

- Opening ceremonies at the finals – dignitaries will be invited.
