EXAMPLES OF VIOLATIONS

It is the responsibility of property owners and tenants to ensure that their property is kept clear of garbage, junk, trash and debris and maintained in a sanitary blight free condition. This includes adjacent sidewalks, streets and public right-of-way.



- Appliances and indoor plumbing fixtures stored outside (such as toilets, sinks or refrigerators).
- Abandoned and broken equipment, cans, engine parts, bottles, household furniture, and scrap metal.
- Lumber cannot be on a property more than 180 days (excluding stacked firewood or lumber for a construction project with a current, valid building permit).
- Accumulation of household garbage in front, side, rear yards or any visible area.

ENFORCEMENT

Property owners and occupants can be issued citations for being in violation of City codes. The first citation is a Violation Warning Notice that identifies the City code that has been violated and the date by which the problem must be corrected.



It is the responsibility of the person(s) cited to comply. If the violation is not corrected by the compliance date, an Administrative Citation with Intent to Abate may be posted with an inspection fee. Additional Administrative Citations with inspection fees and fines may be issued if the problem persists.

REPORTING VIOLATIONS

ASK STOCKTON—You can utilize the City of Stockton website to report violations, track a service request, ask a question, or make a comment.
